

Rules and Regulations

Exhibit A to Agreement to Participate

Participant agrees and understands to follow the rules and regulations set forth below:

Conduct and Rules

1. No violence, physical or verbal, is allowed towards one's self, others, or property.
2. No Illegal activities are allowed by any participant, or by participant's guests, on or off the property (the bedroom space and house).
3. No illegal (child porn) pornography.
4. Gambling is not permitted by participants or guests on the property.
5. No smoking is allowed in the interior of the house. A smoking area outside of the house is designated. Cigarette butts must be disposed of in a safe container.
6. No weapons of any kind are allowed in the house or on the property.
7. No animals or pets are permitted to live in the house without OASIS house written approval. Visitors that bring pets are responsible for cleaning up after them.
8. Overnight absences from the house are not allowed, without permission from the Housing Director.
9. Participants may have one vehicle on the property, provided it is street-legal, licensed, insured, and parked in a designated area.
10. Participants must respect the privacy of all other program participants in their house, as well as being considerate to all house guests, and keep noise levels to a minimum.
11. No fire or open flame (except gas ranges) of any kind will be tolerated within the home, including but not limited to cigarette lighters, candles or incense.
12. Participants must notify the Housing Director immediately in the event that 911 is called for any reason.
13. Participants may not loan money, clothes or other personal property, or “borrow” vehicles, including bikes, from any other participant.
14. No participant is allowed into another participant's room.
15. Participants may not call or communicate with any cable, phone or utility company regarding service to the house. All changes to such service must be done by the Housing Director. Any participant who calls for any service change will be charged \$50 and may additionally be removed from the program and the home.
16. Use of the house phone or house computer shall be limited to 30 minutes whenever any other participant in the house is waiting to use the phone and/or computer.

Housekeeping

17. The house, including all bedrooms, must be kept in a clean orderly fashion; any room may be inspected at any time by a OASIS representative, including the House Manager.
18. The yard and exterior of the property must be kept in a clean and orderly fashion, and up to community standards.
19. The house and any outbuilding must be kept locked. No locks may be changed or added

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without the permission of the Housing Director.

20. No alteration to the interior, exterior or the curtilage of the home is permitted without the approval of the Housing Director.
21. No appliances, including, but not limited to stoves, air conditioners, or space heaters may be brought into, or removed from the house without the prior approval of the Housing Director. All such appliances must be inspected for safety by the Housing Director, or his designee prior to installation into the home.
22. Participants may not change or alter house thermostats. All adjustments of house thermostats must be done by the Housing Director.
23. Participants may not move, rearrange, or remove any house furniture, audio/video equipment, or appliances without the prior approval of the Housing Director.
24. There is to be no moving or rearranging house furniture out of any room without the prior consent of Executive Director.

Medications

25. Participants taking prescription drugs must list all drugs on application to Oasis House, dosage And why you take this medication and changes to medication must be brought to Oasis House Manager and all medication must be stored in lock-boxes approved by the House Director. Any medication that may cause a participant to fail a 10-panel drug screen must be approved in writing by the Housing Director. Please note: OASIS House does not permit medical marijuana under any circumstances.
26. Oasis House may remove a participant if, in the sole opinion of the Housing Director or Executive Director either determines that the participant is over-medicated on prescription drugs or is prescribed a type or level or drugs which make it unsafe for him to live in the house.
27. Participants taking psychotropic and or psychiatric medication must sign a release allowing staff to talk to the prescribing physician.
28. Participants may not take medication(s) that are meant to substitute for their alcohol or drug addiction while in this program. Examples of such medication include but are not limited to the Methadone and Suboxone.

Employment and fees

29. Participants must be employed or actively seeking employment, unless disable and determined to be disabled by the Social Security Administration).
30. Unemployed participants must look for work several hours (e.g. 6 hours), at least 5 days per week. The minimum requirement is two applications per day, filled out and turned in to the house prospective employer. Job-searching should be considered a “full-time” activity. Employment is a mandatory criterion for the program.
31. *Participants must pay their prorated share of the weekly common expenses of the home. Such expenses include, but are not necessarily limited to, the cost of providing bathroom tissue, cleaning supplies, etc.*

Recovery Plan

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- 32. Participants must obtain a sponsor or mentor and choose an AA/NA or any approved peer recovery group which is considered their home group within 60 days of entering the program.
- 33. Participants are required to have a slip signed at AA/NA recovery meetings, and it cannot be from another OASIS program participant. Church bulletins may be used as documentation of required attendance at spiritual meetings. The House Manager may require participants to provide such signed slips or other documentation at mandatory weekly house meetings.

Guest No guest/visitors are allowed in the house without the consent of the OASIS Housing Director Guest/visitors are only allowed in common areas and are not permitted to stay overnight without prior approval of participants in the house and Housing Director.

- 34. All house guests must be approved by the Housing Director. This may include an interview with the guests. All house guests must remain supervised in common areas. The maximum time a guest may visit a participant within a house is 2 hours. Time's of visitation are between 12 noon to 8pm.
- 35. No persons on probation or parole, other than program participants, are allowed in the house or on the property.

General

- 37. If a participant is on probation or parole, their agent will be notified if they leave the program, are terminated from the program, fail a drug test, are intoxicated, or break any laws while in the program.
- 38. When a participant moves, or is removed from the house, no other participant may tamper with or move personal property of the removed participant without authorization from the Housing Director. When packing the personal property of any removed participants, other participants or the Housing Director must be present. If the Housing Director is not present during such packing, a written inventory of all packaging the items.
- 39. The typical stay in the OASIS program is in the range of 6 months to 3 years. All participants must vacate their home after graduation. Upon graduation from the program, successful program graduates are encouraged to apply at that time to serve as mentors and sponsors, House Managers, or sit on the OASIS Board of Directors.

The Guiding Rule

- 40. The most important rule is to remain clean and sober at all times: any violation of this rule will result in immediate removal from the program.

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2. Program Requirements

Participant understands and agrees that:

- a. He will only do work he feels comfortable doing and his skill level is capable of doing without injury to himself or others. He will not hold the landlord and/or homeowner liable for expenses related to injury as a result of work done on any of the Oasis rental properties. He understands any work project of alternation to a home must be approved at the weekly house meetings, by the landlord, and the housing manager. Inspection by a licensed installer of new installations will be the responsibility of the landlord if he/she feels necessary.
- b. That Oasis housing is provided to facilitate a lifestyle that is free from drugs, alcohol crime and other subjects of addiction; that the introduction of addictive materials, intoxicated individuals, violence or criminality into a recovery residence poses a severe threat to the health and well-being of other residents; and that Participant will be removed from the OASIS Program and OASIS Housing if it is determined that he is engaged in activities that pose a threat to the health and well-being of other program participants; and
- c. That, by signing this agreement, Participant acknowledges the understanding that he will be immediately removed from the OASIS Program and OASIS housing upon finding that he has engaged in any form of substance abuse or any other activity that threatens the health, well-being and quiet enjoyment of fellow OASIS Program participants.

3. **GOVERNING LAW AND VENUE:** Participant expressly agrees that this Release is intended to be as broad and inclusive as permitted by the laws of the State of Michigan and that this Release shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Michigan. Venue for any action brought by the undersigned against OASIS shall be in Emmet County, MI.

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Disposition of Participants Personal Property

I, the undersigned, agree that in such case where I vacate the property for any reason or I am unable to take control of my personal property for a period of 24 hours, I authorize OASIS to release all of my property to the following person after my absence or unavailability. In the event the person named below is unavailable or unwilling to take immediate possession of such personal property, I authorize OASIS to remove and store or dispose of such personal property at sole discretion. In the event OASIS elects to store my personal property, I agree to pay OASIS a storage fee equal to \$100 per month. In the event such personal property remains unclaimed by me after said 30 days, I authorize OASIS to dispose of personal property, and that OASIS may dispose of my abandoned or unclaimed personal property in the nearest dumpster and I waive any claim I may have for such actions by OASIS.

Substance Screening Policy & Agreement

The primary purpose of OASIS House is to give our men a home environment that is ideally suited for successful recovery. When a participant chooses to use drugs or alcohol, he threatens the recovery of everybody in his home. As such, we have zero tolerance policy for drug and alcohol use. This includes use inside and outside of our homes, and applies to ALL mind-altering substances, whether legal or illegal.

Synthetic versions of illegal drugs (i.e. “spice” and “bath salts”) are absolutely forbidden in our program. We can and do test for these substances,

We do not allow for the use of medical marijuana by our participants. Use of marijuana, for any reason, even with prescription, will result in immediate removal from the program.

We do not allow for the use of “maintenance” drugs such as methadone, suboxone, and subutex.

All participants are required to complete the drug test within 8 hours of request by OASIS staff.

Program Entry:

Upon entering the OASIS House program, new participants will be required to undergo a drug screen. To be approved for entry into our program, this test must show a “negative” result for all drugs that are not prescribed by a physician.

Random Substance Testing:

Random drug screens and alcohol tests are performed on all program participants. A positive result for any substance will result in immediate removal from the program unless that substance is prescribed by a physician. Refusal to submit a sample for a random test will result in immediate removal from the program. Any positive results or refusal will be reported to the participant's parole or probation officer, if applicable.

Reasonable Suspicion Testing:

In addition to random testing, program participants will be subject to drug and alcohol testing where a member of the OASIS House staff has a reasonable basis to believe that the participant has engaged in drug or alcohol use.

Testing Procedure:

Testing will, in most cases, be conducted in participant's home or in the OASIS House office. In some cases, tests will be conducted at the Quick Care Med Center or Harbor Hall. Failure to cooperate with OASIS House staff or Med Center staff will result in immediate removal from the program.

If a test performed by OASIS House staff indicates that the participant has attempted deception (i.e. by submitting a diluted or fake sample), the participant will be required to undergo a secure test at the Quick Care Med Center or Harbor Hall. If the Med Center staff reports that a participant has attempted

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to deceive a test, the participant will be immediately removed from the program and the attempted deception will be reported to his parole or probation officer, if applicable.

Cost:

OASIS will cover the costs of all routine drug and alcohol testing(In house testing only). However, where additional costs are incurred due to a dishonest act on the part of the participant (i.e. submitting an adulterated sample), the participant will be required to reimburse OASIS House for the additional costs.

OASIS House will provide transportation to and from the Quick Care Med Center when necessary.

By signing this form, I agree to submit to the substance screening policy and I understand I will be expelled from the OASIS program immediately upon a positive result of a substance test.

Guest Name: (please print) _____, and (OASIS House) agree to the following:

The OASIS House Sober Living environment allows guest the use of beds and common areas of the premises located at 2596 Howard Road, Guests understand that 2596 Howard Road, Petoskey, MI is a sober living home. Guests agree to not pursue any legal action against Brad Houle (OASIS House) or Care Taker or its Employees.

Guests agree to pay a sober living fee of \$ _____ per month (in advance) for guest privileges at 2596 Howard Road. You may be asked to move out if payment is not made within 72 hours after due date.

Guest agrees to also deposit with Owner/Agent a security deposit, the sum of \$500 on or before move in. Residents shall not sure this security deposit to pay any weeks rent during their stay. However, at Owner/Agent's discretion, if Guest has successfully fulfilled and met all terms and conditions of this agreement, including giving Owner/Agent a 30 day written notice prior to termination of tenancy, Owner/Agent may allow this deposit to serve as payment to the final week of Guest stay. This Deposit shall be applied towards the following:

- 1) To repair any damages to the premises, or, the property enclosed therein, caused by Guest.
- 2) Financial hardship caused to Owner/Agent due to Guests failure to give Owner/Agent proper notice of termination of tenancy, which is outlined within this agreement. Including, but not limited to, lost sober living fees due to unforeseen vacancy of Guests living area.

Guest also agree that if for any reason, they are asked to leave due to non-compliance of this agreement, whether it is by drug or alcohol screening, violations of House Rules, or Guest being delinquent in their sober living fees for more than 72 hours, then the security deposit will be forfeited to Owner/Agent for recovery of any financial loss caused by Guest.

Guest realizes that this is not considered a rental property but a sober living environment and waives the right to be served a 3 day notice. Guests also waive the right of the eviction process. Guests agree to give a 30 day written notice when the guests ready to move out.

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The Name: OASIS House is serving as a refuge, relief and pleasant environment for positive changes. You no longer have to live in a desert.

House Philosophy: _____

In Our recovery we have admitted to ourselves that our lives are unmanageable. We have chosen to use this house as our opportunity to change our lives in a positive way. Each day we are willing to go any lengths to achieve the change in our lives we are seeking. OASIS House is a structured sober living environment. Here you have the option of learning behaviors and habits that will stay with you when you leave. While there will be challenges and opportunities for everyone as we grow together in our sobriety, we must avoid the unwillingness to be vulnerable within the group. Those who are not genuinely open with one another about their own mistakes and weaknesses make it impossible to build a foundation for trust. Guests that lack trust are incapable of engaging in unfiltered and passionate debate of ideas and problem solution. Instead, they resort to veiled discussions and guarded comments. A lack of healthy conflict is a problem. Without having aired opinions in the course of passionate and open debate, guest can rarely, if ever, experience the growth they are seeking. We must not hesitate to call our housemates on actions and behaviors that seem counterproductive to the good of the house. Failure to hold one another accountable creates an environment where dysfunction can thrive and sobriety and serenity are threatened.

House Rules: _____

The Guests of OASIS House who have come before you have contributed to creating these rule based on their experiences. The house rules can, and will be changed as the dynamics of the house change. These House Rules are provided to help you understand exactly what the minimum expectations are while you are a guest at OASIS House. It is important that you carefully review and fully understand OASIS House philosophy and rules before you make the choice to stay at OASIS House. If you choose to be a Guest it is important for you to be committed and adhere to the lifestyle we are trying to create with our philosophy and these basic rules. If you have concerns after reviewing these rules, OASIS House may not be an environment that is right for you.

House Meetings: _____

1. House meetings are necessary to maintain a positive and supportive environment. Therefore, they are mandatory for all house guests.
2. House meetings are held Sunday at 6:30pm (at managers decision) or as needed.
3. The objective of this meeting is to support OASIS House philosophy and bring issues to the group for discussion and resolutions.

Meeting format: _____

4. Management will provide a weekly update
5. Each guest will have a limited time to articulate problems experienced during the week
6. Problems that require extensive discussions will be discussed with management prior to the weekly house meeting.
7. Group resolution will be reached and implemented

Peer Recovery Support Meetings: _____

This is a living Recovery Home, Peer Support is essential to Recovery. You must find Peer Recovery Support Meetings that resonate with you to see and be the change you want to make. Your example and the examples you see will let you remain focused on growth within the community. Staying connected with like-minded friends is one of the most important tools we in the recovery can wield; we therefore require guests to attend Peer Recovery Support Meetings. You will attend 3 meetings per week. We highly suggest more in early Recovery.

| Kitchen | <p>Dishes and/or food are to be put away and removed from counters. Food: Each guest is responsible for their own food and should eat only what they have purchased themselves. Housekeeping: _____

Learning to live in a clean orderly environment is an important part of sobriety. Guests are expected to demonstrate pride in the entire facility by keeping it neat and clean at all times. The overriding rule of the house is that each guest will leave all areas of the house they use, clean or cleaner than you found it. The following guidelines for each room are as followed:

Chores are to be done daily: _____

Chores will be assigned to each guest and need to be done daily, chores are from Sunday to Monday. Assignment of chores will be assigned by the house manager and are subject to change.

TV Use: _____

If you are watching TV and are joined by additional guest(s), you may finish watching your current program. When your program has concluded, please be courteous and allow the next program to be agreed upon by the guest(s) who are watching TV.

Respect for Yourself: _____

1. Part of our path to live with sobriety is to maintain healthy grooming habits at all times.
2. Residents are asked to shower and change clothes daily
3. Clothing will be neat and clean at all times.

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Respect for Others: _____

1. Guest are expected to take pride in themselves by demonstrating that they are a polite and courteous person.
2. Racial or other negative comments will not be tolerated. Persistent profanity demonstrates hostility and disrespect for others. Anyone who chooses to speak in such a way will be expelled from OASIS House.
3. If saying “please” “thank you” “you're welcome” is not a habit, make it one,
4. Any guest who does not consistently show respect and courtesy to others will be told to leave the facility.
5. Every guest as OASIS House is entitled to be treated with dignity.

Driveway/Garage Use: _____

1. Keeping OASIS House grounds presentable is important to all of us. As such, there can be no leaking vehicles parked in the driveway.
2. Parking in driveway is prioritized as follows: management and Brad Houle.
3. It is important that the guests using the driveway communicate with others using the driveway to ensure access in and out as needed.

Visitors: _____

1. Visiting hours are no more than 2 hours between 12 noon and 8pm.
2. So that guest are not mistakenly wondering into private bedroom areas in the house, visitors are to use ½ bathroom #1.
3. Visitors (including sponsors and recovery coaches) are not allowed in bedrooms at any time. Probation Agents will have access on demand.
4. Sponsors and other sober members of the recovery community are welcomed for recovery meetings anytime.
5. House BBQ's are held at the discretion of OASIS House Management and will be discussed with Guests at group conscious meetings prior to scheduled events.
6. Visitors that are under the influence of alcohol or drugs are strictly prohibited from being on OASIS House property at any time.

Medicine: _____

1. All medicine, prescription and over-the-counter drugs/vitamins must be registered with OASIS House management. No narcotics without checking them in with staff.

Curfew: _____

1. Guest must be in the house and accounted for by the following curfew times:
 - 11:00 pm Sunday through Thursday
 - 12:30 am Friday and Saturday
2. Missing curfew by 15 minutes or more is considered a house violation. 1st time receives a verbal warning. 2nd time receives a written warning. 3rd time is grounds for expulsion.

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Over Night Passes: _____

1. Overnight passes may be considered for guest who have completed 30 consecutive days in the housekeeping.
2. All passes are granted at the discretion of the OASIS House Staff. Passes must be filled out and turned in 24 hours in advance.

Lights Out: _____

1. At 11:00pm bedrooms will be used as sleeping environment. Please be courteous to your roommates if you choose to read in bed.
2. Common area TV and radios are turned off at 12am during week and 1am on weekends.
3. Leaving the house to go outside is not permitted after lights out.

Relapse Policy

If you relapse and are caught using or test “dirty” you are subject to immediate dismissal from the house. If it is your first violation, providing the house agrees you have been trying and your attitude has been good, you must leave the house immediately and detox at a recognized detox facility and be checked out by staff (no leaving AMA).

If and only if house management agrees you can return to the house, you may return AFTER 72 HOURS and be charged a \$175.00 RE-ENTRY FEE

You must continue to pay your Sobriety Fee and keep it current when you are in detox. If there is a future relapse, it dramatically increases the chance you will NOT be allowed to return for a 30 day period. At any time you are asked not to return, you forfeit whatever is left of your Recovery Fee for that month.

A Recovery Fee cannot be requested while you are in detox if the house does not allow you to return. You are not a TENANT and have no tenant-landlord rights. If management decides you are not a candidate for re-entry, you may not return to the house. A decision will be made in your absence, You must pack your belongings immediately upon testing dirty and be ready to leave the premises immediately. Hanging around and arguing will only lead to management calling the police and having you escorted off the premises or arrested if need be. Stepping back on the premises will be considered trespassing if you are banned from the house. We will call a taxicab for you if management cannot give you a ride to the detox center or out of the neighborhood where someone can pick you up at a designated hotel or bus stop. You will have 30 minutes to pack your things and be out the door before the police will be called and told you are not welcome on the property. Depending on the police, they may be advised to take you to lock-up if you are being difficult, get argumentative or violent.

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YOU ARE NOT A TENANT. UNDER STATE LAW, YOU RECOGNIZE AND ADMIT THAT INSOFAR AS OUR ABILITY TO REQUEST THAT YOU LEAVE THE HOUSE FOR ANY REASON WE DEEM NECESSARY TO MAINTAIN THE HOUSE ATMOSPHERE AS ONE CONDUCIVE TO SOBRIETY, THAT YOU ARE NOT LEGALLY A TENANT INSOFAR AS TRADITIONAL LANDLORD-TENANT RELATIONSHIPS GO.

This effectiviely means that you have no recourse under the law protecting your housing rights as they would normally apply to a traditional tenant under a typical lease agreement. You are giving management total discretion to dictate whether you may continue to remain at the house or not, and for any reason management feels at their discretion it is necessary for you to leav the house, you must obey their final decision on this matter. Any lawsuits or retaliatory legal efforts on your part will be deemed frivolous and if a case ever makes it to your court or arbitration, you will be responsible for the legal fees the house must pay to defend itself. There is a good reason that the fee you pay to stay at such a house is called a Recovery Fee, and not rent.

DISCIPLINE POLICY

- A verbal warning will be issues for any CODE RULES that are violated by a guest
- The first verbal warning will be followed by a written warning
- Three written warnings will be considered 1 strike (any repeated codes during this write up period will constitute another strike which will lead to automatic expulsion from OASIS House).
- After the first strike is issues, a verbal warning will be given to constitute the second and final set of write-ups. Three write-ups in this phase would be considered your second stroke and the guest will be asked to leave THE HOUSE.
